# Message from Mr Bridgeman

Between Tuesday and Thursday, Blenheim, Camelot, Discovery and Gala took part in a Nationwide Maths competition on Times Table Rockstars called 'England Rocks!' Over 4,000 schools took part, with the winners being the school with the highest average of correct answers per child during the competition period. Our children got thoroughly involved, with teachers showing classes live updated leader boards showing our school competing against schools from London, Liverpool and many other places across England. Due to the commitment of our children, Curry Rivel achieved some amazing results:

- Our school finished 130th out of 4400 schools.
- Curry Rivel was the 8th best school in the South of England.
- Blenheim Class finished 93rd out of 30,000 classes taking part, putting them in the top 0.4% across the country!
